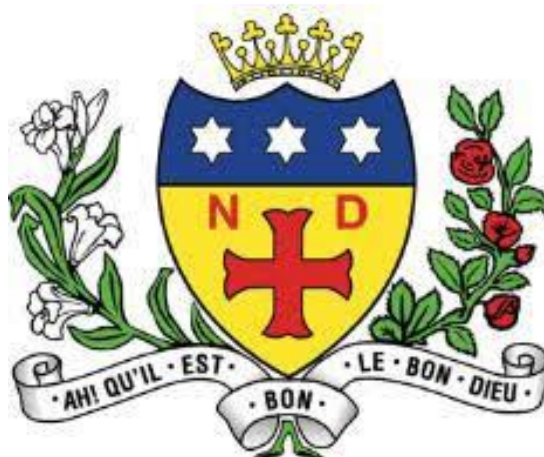

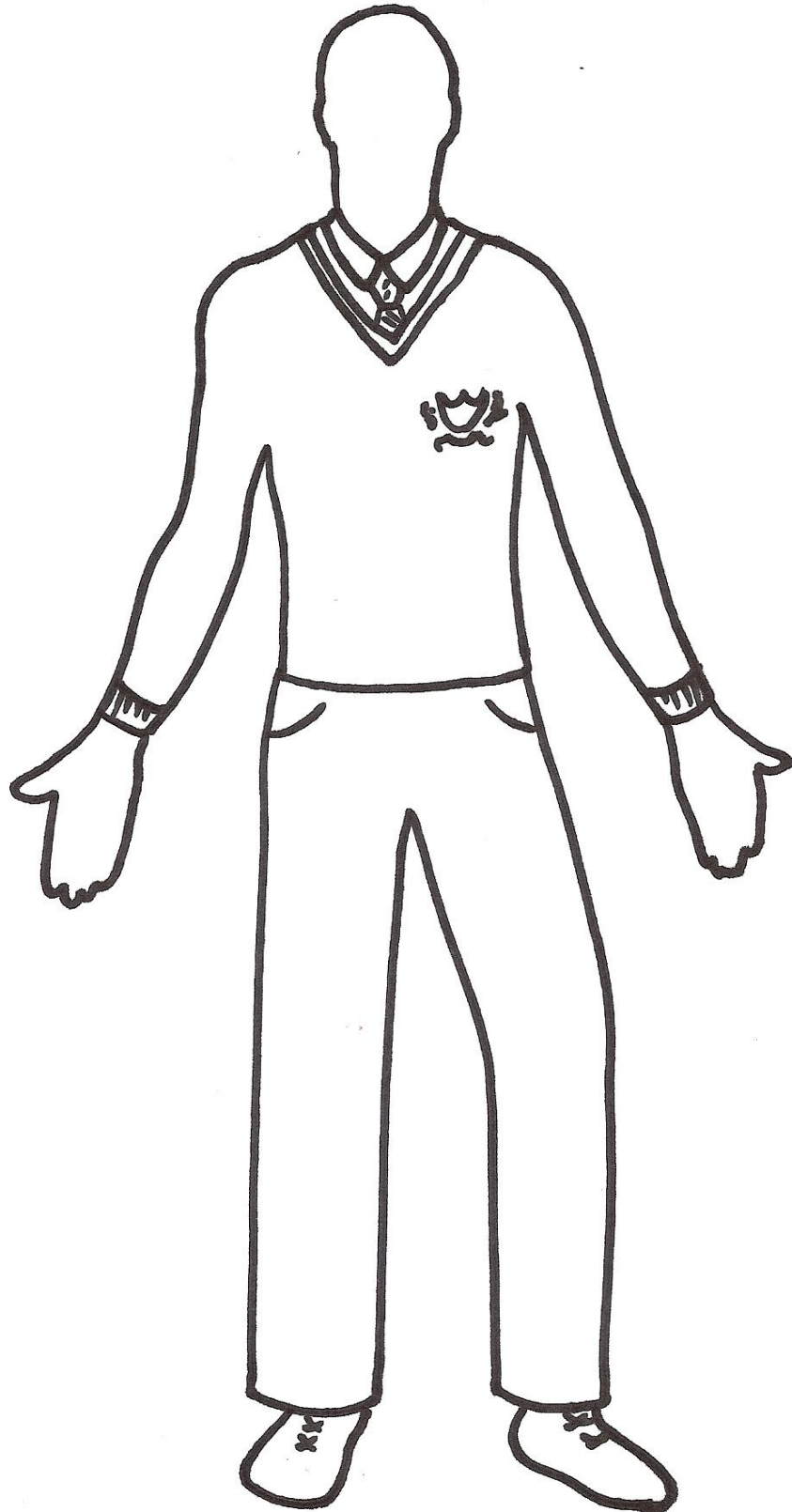

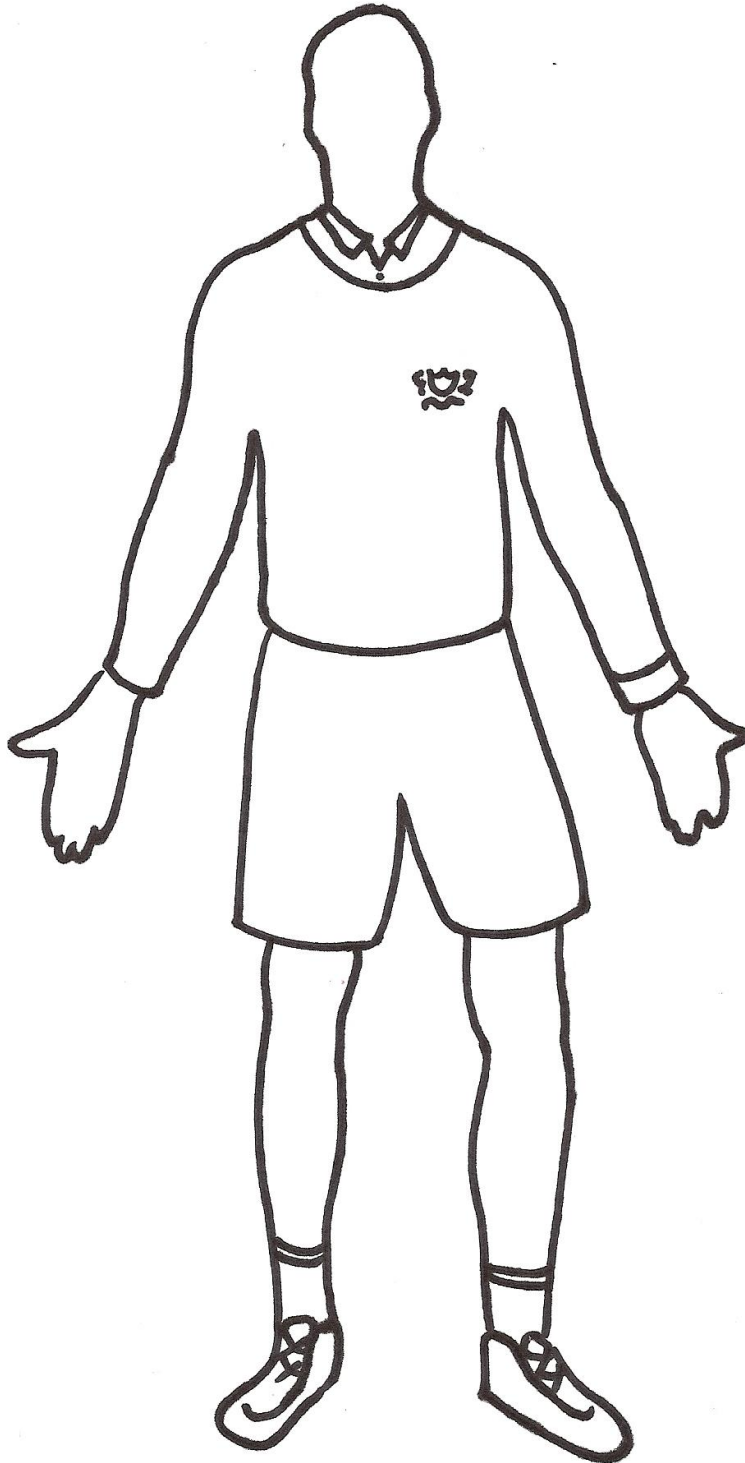

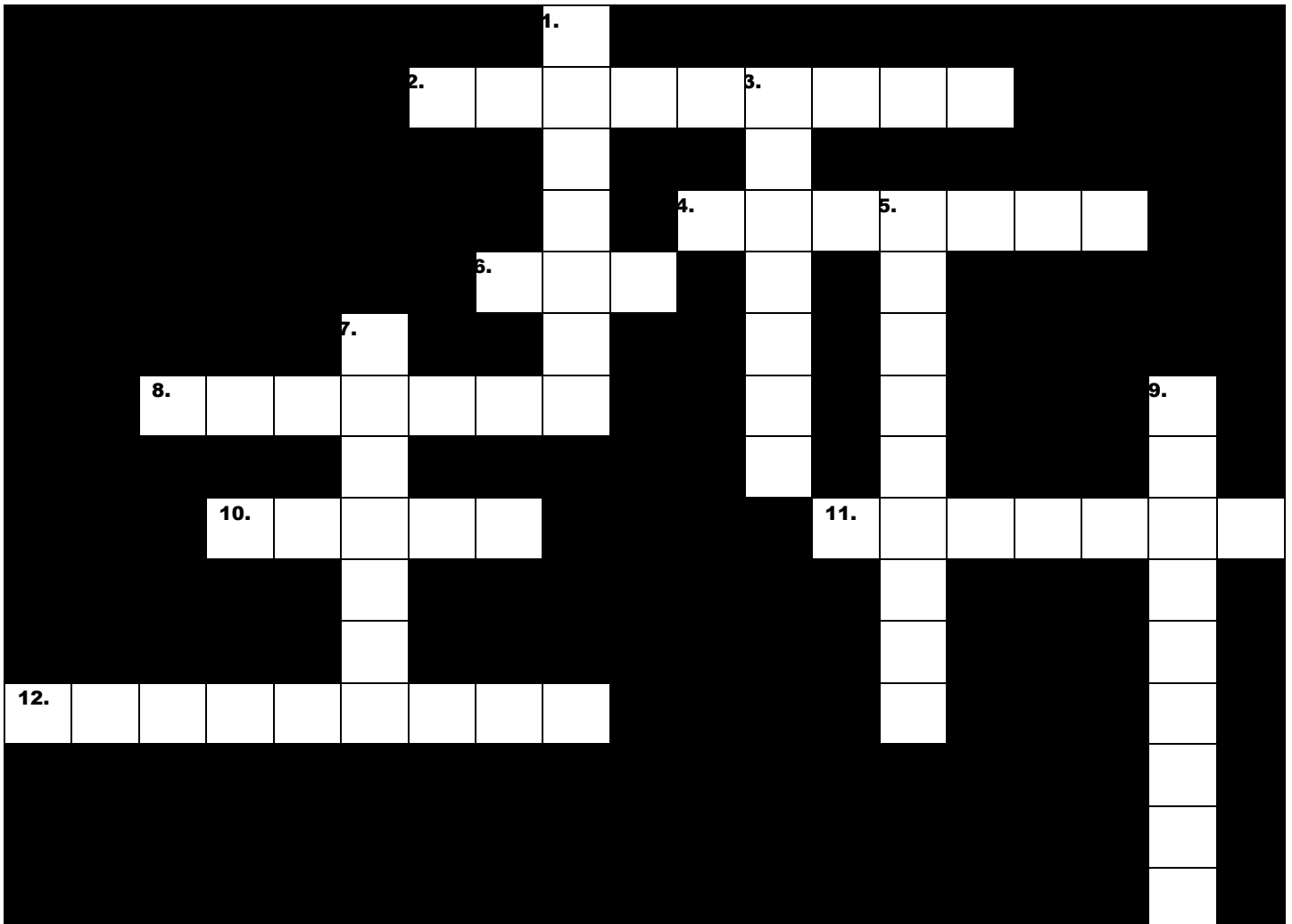

St Julie and the Sisters of Notre Dame

Our school is special. It was started by a group of women called the Sisters of Notre Dame ('Notre Dame' is French for 'Our Lady', meaning the Virgin Mary, mother of Jesus). They believe that it is important for everybody to have an education, so they start free schools in places where children might not otherwise be able to go to school.

The Sisters of Notre Dame were started by a woman called St. Julie - although she wasn't a saint then! **We use the names of some of the places where St Julie lived as the names of our four houses in school.** These names are underlined.

Marie Rose Julie Billiard was born in the village of Cuvilly, in a region of France called Picardy in 1751. Even as a young girl she knew she wanted to be a teacher, and her friends would ask her to tell stories from the bible and she would teach them about God. Julie made her First Holy Communion when she was nine years old. Julie's family became very poor so Julie went to work in the fields, but she continued to teach the people she worked with while they ate their lunches.

One day, someone shot at Julie's father. Julie suffered a shock which resulted in her becoming paralysed and bed-ridden. However, she was determined not to give up on her dream and she continued to teach the children who came to her bed side.

Because she loved God and was doing His work, Julie's life was in danger during the French Revolution. She escaped from the house where she had been living in a hay cart and went to the town of Compiègne. Whilst she was in hiding she saw in a dream a vision of some women wearing black and white gathered around the Cross of Christ. She realised that they would be an important part of her life and the way that the women were dressed would later become the uniform for all of her Sisters of Notre Dame. Trusting in God, Julie, along with her friend Françoise, made the vows of Poverty, Chastity and Obedience in the chapel of their house. Here she began the teaching and instructing of children. Julie was miraculously cured of her paralysis and was blessed with supernatural gifts of prayer and healing. More women came to join Julie and the Sisters spread into Belgium. There are now Sisters of Notre Dame all over the world. St Julie is associated with sunflowers because she said, *"Just as the sunflower always turns and follows the sun, so we should always turn our hearts and minds towards God."*

Eternal peace came to Julie when she died during Holy Week on April 8, 1816. On the 13th May each year we celebrate the day when St. Julie was declared Blessed.
