School bags at Notre Dame

1. RATIONALE:

Bags need to be fit for purpose so that they keep books, equipment and other items (e.g. textbooks, letters, journals) in good condition. This requires them to be large enough for A4 files and books (used in many departments) and waterproof to avoid contents getting wet. They should also have a 'shape' to them to avoid letters/certificates/books getting creased.

- 2. **Bags need to be sensible to avoid the carrying of them to damage backs/shoulders etc.** We are aware that bags can become relatively heavy, so a long strap or a rucksack is needed to spread the weight across the body to avoid damaging backs and shoulders.
- 3. **Bags should be appropriate for a place of work.** School, as a place of work, requires uniform that reflects this. This means that bags, such as handbags, are not allowed.

BAGS POLICY:

- preferably a rucksack, which is better for backs
- must be waterproof
- large enough to accommodate A4 files and textbooks
- must be able to fasten closed
- have a strap long enough to be carried on the back or across the body
- **no** fashion handbags (ie. with short handles, buckles or padlocks)
- no camouflage or animal print/skin effect bags

BELOW ARE PICTURES OF RECOMMENDED SCHOOL BAG STYLES:



We recommend a rucksack or satchel-type bag, as these fit the policy most closely and are:

- most fit for purpose
- spread the weight across the body or on the shoulders
- appropriate for a place of work

Please note that there are hardship funds available at school to buy bags for students who cannot afford a bag that fits the policy. Please contact school if this is the case.
