

# What underpins our uniform policy?

- **Community identity** –think football teams
- **Equality & Inclusivity;**
  - especially for those with financial barriers
  - avoiding a subgroup identity that may be in conflict with the values and ethos of the school or cause conflict
- **Ready to learn** – rules around waterproof coats, shoes and bags are to ensure that despite poor weather, students are dry and comfortable and able to learn.
- **Health & Safety** – PE, practical subjects



## Common issues

### Skirts

- Have to have the badge which must be visible  
–no old style skirts
- Worn to the knee

### Jumper

- School jumper must be worn and not the PE sweatshirt during the day
- It must come to school everyday
- The jumper is the school uniform not a coat. If a student needs to wear a coat then their jumper must be on as well

### Hoodies/Sweatshirts/Coats with logos

- These should not be worn at any time in school- including leaving the premises
- If a student is cold in winter they need to layer up underneath the polo shirt and jumper



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# Common issues



## Shoes

All black full leather school shoes: flat, full show covering all of the top of the foot and fastened onto the foot with laces or straps.

*'Slip ons' – only if cover the majority of the foot*

*Doc Martens- yellow stitching- ok*

Shoe should be suitable for all weather types and wipeable

No fabric, suede, mesh, canvas, no coloured logos



## Trainers

Trainers are not allowed during the school day- only at break or lunch if involved in sport.

Students must arrive to your lesson with their school shoes on.

Students must have trainers for PE- that can bend!!!!
