You do not need to write the entire essay, you might practise writing an intro, list the issues you would raise. • Practise your chain-of-reasoning, writing chunky paragraphs. • Try to keep up-to-date with current Economics news (once a week minimum). Examiners love this context. • Suggested structure based on 5 hrs revision a week (2 hrs theory/2 hrs exam question focus/1hr current issues & examples)
