

Assessment Requirements: Your Level 3 qualification in Health and Social Care is structured, and examined, in the following way:

<p>In this unit you will develop an understanding of the ways public health and wellbeing is promoted in order to benefit society as a whole and to reduce health inequalities.</p> <p>You will gain an understanding of current public health strategies and initiatives and consider the effectiveness and the implications of health policy for the wider population.</p> <p>This unit is internally assessed and externally moderated. Students will complete a portfolio of work which meets the assessment criteria. This unit involves assessment comprising of P1, P2, P3, M1, D1.</p>	<p>In this unit you will learn about the importance of infection control and you will be introduced to methods that help to prevent the spread of infection.</p> <p>All of this will enable you to apply infection control methods in the workplace effectively.</p> <p>This unit is internally assessed and externally moderated. Students will complete a portfolio of work which meets the assessment criteria. This unit involves assessment comprising of P1-10, M1-4, D1-2.</p>	<p>This unit aims to introduce you to the basic structure and functions of the body systems involved in everyday activities and maintenance of health, including cardiovascular, respiratory and digestive systems.</p> <p>You will also understand the part played by organs such as the pancreas, liver and kidney. You will investigate the systems and organs involved in detecting and responding to change such as the nervous system as well as the eyes and ears.</p> <p>There are 6 learning objectives that you will cover in the teaching programme. All of which will be assessed in the exam.</p> <p>Your exam paper will consist of a variety of different questions. These can be True or False questions, filling in the blanks, labelling parts of the human body, as well as general questions.</p> <p>Questions may be worth up to 1 mark, whilst others could require extended answers and be worth up to 10 marks.</p> <p>You have 2 hours to complete this exam paper.</p>
