It might have been a short half term but it has been packed full of activities and events!

For me, the highlight of the half term was the Shoah service, which we commemorated with Y9. The service took place on Holocaust Memorial Day, on the 27th January. This date was chosen to commemorate the date when the Auschwitz concentration camp was liberated in 1945. On this day all around the world we remember the killing of six million Jews, two-thirds of Europe's Jewish population, and millions of others by the Nazi regime and its collaborators. It is also a time to remember the genocides that have followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. The service was incredibly moving and our Y9 students showed impeccable respect throughout. My thanks go to Mr Scriven, Mr Neal, Mrs Wragg and Mr O'Farrell who led us on this special occasion.

In other news

History Department

The History Department were very involved in delivering further activities to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day. This year the Holocaust Memorial Day Trust (HMDT) set the theme as 'ordinary people,' and form time sessions have focused on ordinary people and the Holocaust each week. These sessions will lay the foundations for later study of the Holocaust in the summer term of Y8.

On Wednesday 25th January an outreach worker from the HMDT came into school to deliver a range of workshops to our Y7, Y8 and Y9 students. These workshops looked at topics such as; what was the Holocaust? Jewish resistance to the Holocaust, anti-Jewish laws in Germany and the Kindertransport rescue project. Our students were so keen to get involved and learn as much as possible in preparation for Holocaust Memorial Day.

Four of our sixth form History students have also been selected to take part in the Lessons from Auschwitz project this year. The students have the opportunity to take part in two seminars, listening to a talk by a Holocaust survivor. The students will also be visiting Auschwitz-Birkenau as part of this project. Following this they will be sharing what they have learnt from the project with students lower down in school, so please look out for this later on in the year.

Thackray Museum School Trip

On the 19th January the History Department took a number of our Y9 and Y10 GCSE History students on a school trip to the Thackray Museum of Medicine in Leeds. The trip was a huge success, with students being able to recap the content they have already studied for their GCSEs, whilst being able to participate in a workshop that introduced students to the next part of our course. The workshop was about the First World War, and medicine on the Western Front.

Students enjoyed being able to study artefacts from the museum and use source material to learn about injuries, shell shock, new medical developments and the role of women during the war. Students also enjoyed tracking medical developments through time and take a tour

down 'disease street'. The museum staff were so helpful in guiding our students through the important history of medicine and developing their understanding of source analysis, a key skill students' focus on during our exam.
