

Dear Parent/Carer,

As we move further into Advent, and draw towards the end of what has been a particularly long and tiring term for our 6th form students (and staff!), I would like to share with you some thoughts on how things have gone, as well as share some information about next term.

Year 12 have settled in very well indeed and are quite clearly a formidable group of very able and talented young people. I am particularly impressed by how the students who joined us in September from around 25 other local secondary schools, are now very much a part of our Notre Dame community. I am also delighted with their approach to 6th form and the aptitude for learning shown by the students this term. I mentioned recently that in many ways the hardest part of 6th form is behind them; the steepest and most difficult part of the journey from GCSE to A level is now over. They won't again experience the 'shock to the system' of facing such challenging study after so many weeks of not being in a classroom! Although we are only at the end of the first term of Y12, we do need to start thinking about our students' next step. On Thursday 23rd March 2023, at 6pm, we will be holding our higher education information evening where you can find out more about the process of applying to higher education, as well as the costs and benefits involved. Details of this event will be circulated nearer the time.

Year 13 have also settled in well to their A2 studies and are a highly motivated, committed and focussed year group. It's particularly pleasing to hear so much positive news around UCAS applications, successful interviews and offers of university places. We have all been so impressed by their fantastically positive approach this term. 152 UCAS applications have been submitted, with over 100 students having at least 1 offer. On Tuesday 17th January 2023, we have our Y13 parents' evening which will take place in school, details on how to make appointments will be shared before the end of term.

Just over 2 weeks later, commencing Monday 6th February, brings the biggest challenge of sixth form so far with the first of two assessment weeks we have planned for our Y13 students. The students have been emailed the assessment timetable and a revision list to help with their planning. A second assessment week will allow students and teachers to further their preparation for their final exams, this will take place week commencing 24th April 2023.

On Thursday 22nd December, during period 3, we gather in St John's Church for our end of term Advent service. This is one of our community milestones and all students are expected to attend. If for one reason or another a student needs to be excused from this service, they need to seek permission from me. Students will then be free to start their Christmas holiday early when the service ends at around 12:45pm.

Finally, let me take this opportunity to offer you and your family the warmest best wishes for this forthcoming holiday. May peace and love surround you all this Christmas, and the light of Jesus shine always in your hearts.
