Welcome to this the 4th edition of ND VOICE, which includes as a supplement the 1st edition of Notre News, the sixth form newspaper created by some of our super talented Y12 students. As we move closer to the end of Lent and the good news that Easter brings, it was a privilege over the last week to share in one of our student community milestones.

On Monday March 27th with Y12, and Tuesday 4th April with Y13, we gathered as a community for a service of 'the Stations of the Cross.' The Stations of the Cross mark the 14 events that occurred leading up to Christ's crucifixion on Good Friday.

The 14 stations are displayed as wall plaques around the Salle. During the service, 14 students from years 7 to 13 were each stood under one of the stations where they read out the event marked by their station, followed by a reflection and then a prayer.

A short piece of reflective Taizé chant music was played as we paused between each station and the microphone was passed on! At the end of the service we shared a period of silent and prayerful reflection.

The students' behaviour and conduct throughout was nothing short of impeccable. Our chair of governors, Mr Colclough, was visiting us on the morning of the 27th and was very impressed by the whole ambience and slickness of the service. He commented on the prayerful reverence shown by the students throughout, but particularly at the silent finish and egress.

Next term we say goodbye to our fabulous Y13 students and need to turn our attention to their leaving arrangements. The year group are a fantastic bunch of talented, engaging and hardworking young people. They showed great resolve, resilience and positivity through the difficulties that Covid brought to their GCSE years and deserve to 'finish well'.

Y13 Finance, Accommodation and firm choice advice

Applications for student finance are now open and will close on 31st May 2023. Students do not need to have heard from all their choices, nor do they need to have confirmed their firm and insurance choices to apply for student finance.

Accommodation is booked directly through universities and students need to have confirmed their firm choice before they book any accommodation. It is highly unlikely universities will allow accommodation to be booked for insurance choices.

We strongly recommend that students put their first choice university as their firm choice, but are sensible and realistic with their insurance choice, giving themselves more options on A Level results day. Students need to keep checking their UCAS Hub as this informs students of deadline dates, specific to their application.
