Remember to think carefully about the bullet points you want to include on the candidate record form and prepare lots of information about each of these points.</p> <p>It is important for both the IRP and the speaking stimulus card to show you have knowledge of the topic specifically relating to French-speaking communities and that you can give opinions with reasons, justify your point of view, analyse and evaluate the topic.</p> <p>For your essay writing, remember that you need to show good concise knowledge of the book and the film, but that you also need to display sophisticated language via complex structures, vocab and grammar. For both the writing and the speaking, it is therefore important to think in advance about the phrases and grammar you want to show you can use accurately.
