<p><u>Glossaries:</u></p> <p>You have been provided with glossaries at the start of the course and have added to and annotated these. Remember to refer to them in your revision.</p>	<p><u>Advice and Guidance for Revision</u></p> <p>Remember that the exam technique in both Paper One and Paper Two for the essay questions is THE SAME! This means you will have/have already lots of practice at these skills.</p> <p>Your textbooks have lots of examples of extract, source and essay questions in them – use these as part of your revision.</p> <p>Paper One You will be provided with revision booklets that cover the whole period of the course in terms of both essay and extract questions. Use these and bring in what you have done to show us. You do not need to write whole essays every time – a plan is useful to test your knowledge or a couple of paragraphs to look at your paragraph technique.</p> <p>The questions in this paper will be a minimum of 20 years in coverage. This means you are likely to be asked to compare and contrast something or two rulers. Completing theme tables covering the range of the course is a helpful way to revise to prepare for this. For example, religion is a major factor in our course. Make a table and divide it up into decades and put precise examples of how religion features in that decade – it may be religious policy, conflict, or promotion of different religious groups. Do this for each decade and you have a simple comparison resource for revision.</p> <p>Paper Two You will be provided with revision resources that cover the whole course and focus on specifics – this is a depth study so you do need to know events, and the significance of them, in detail.</p>
