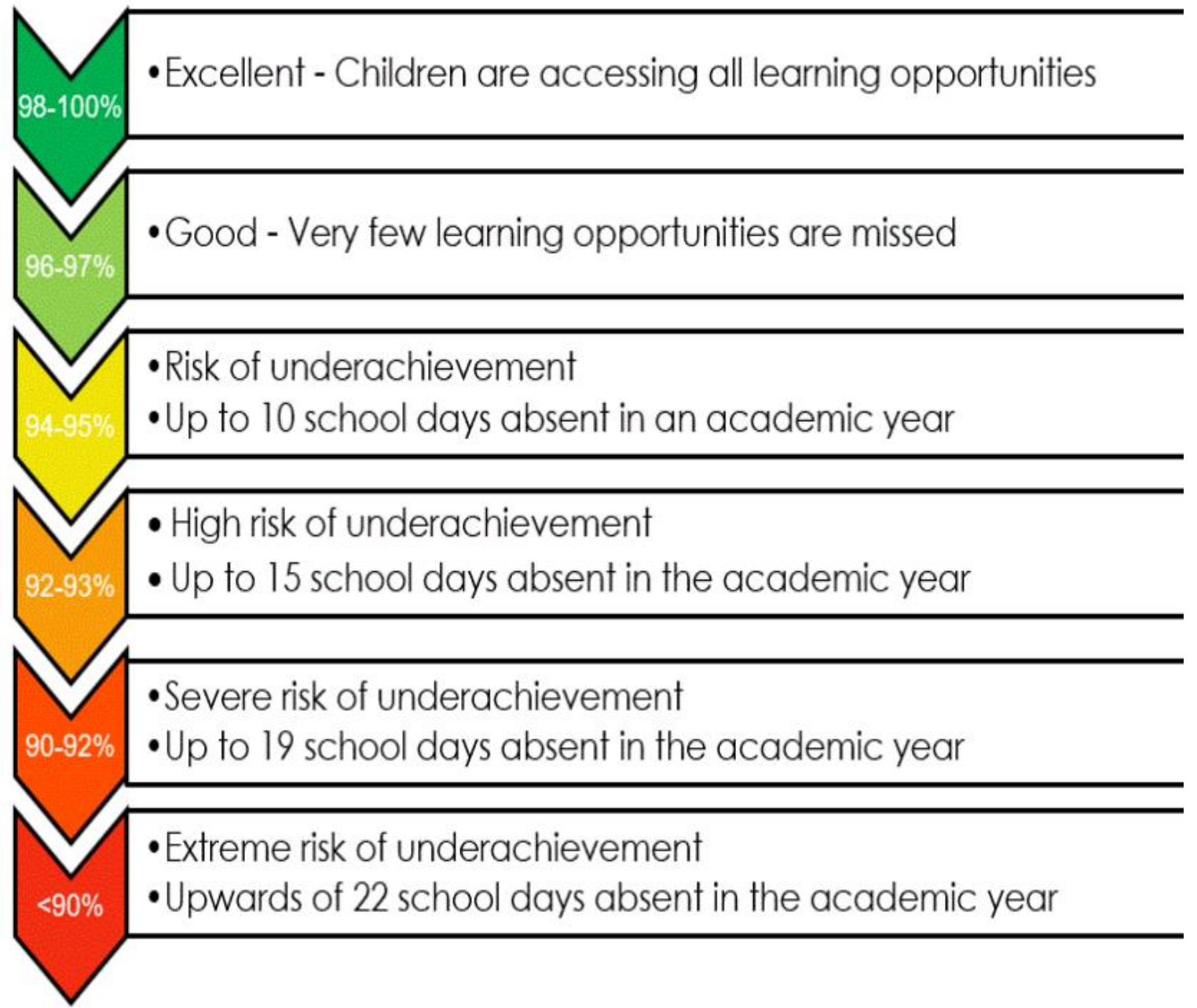
Why does attendance matter?

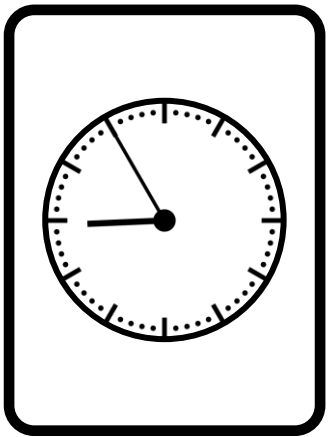
- You fall behind in work and lessons.

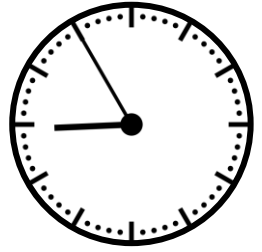

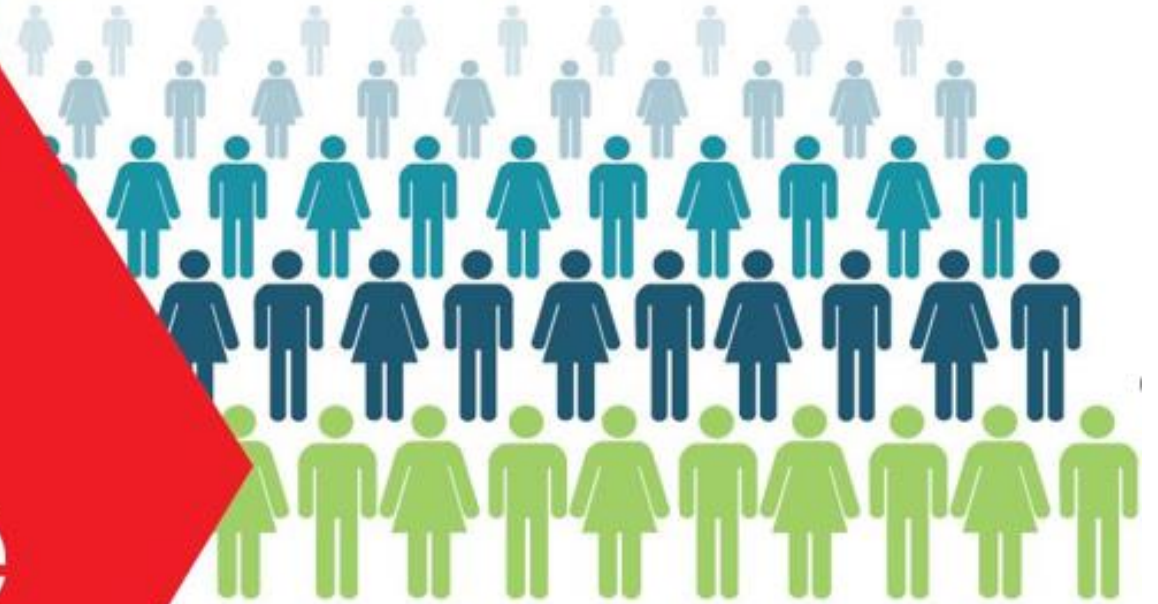
Failure by parents to ensure regular attendance at school is an offence punishable by law (*Education Act 1996 Section 444*)

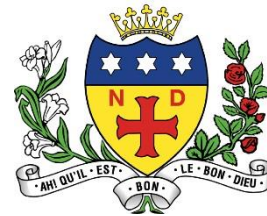

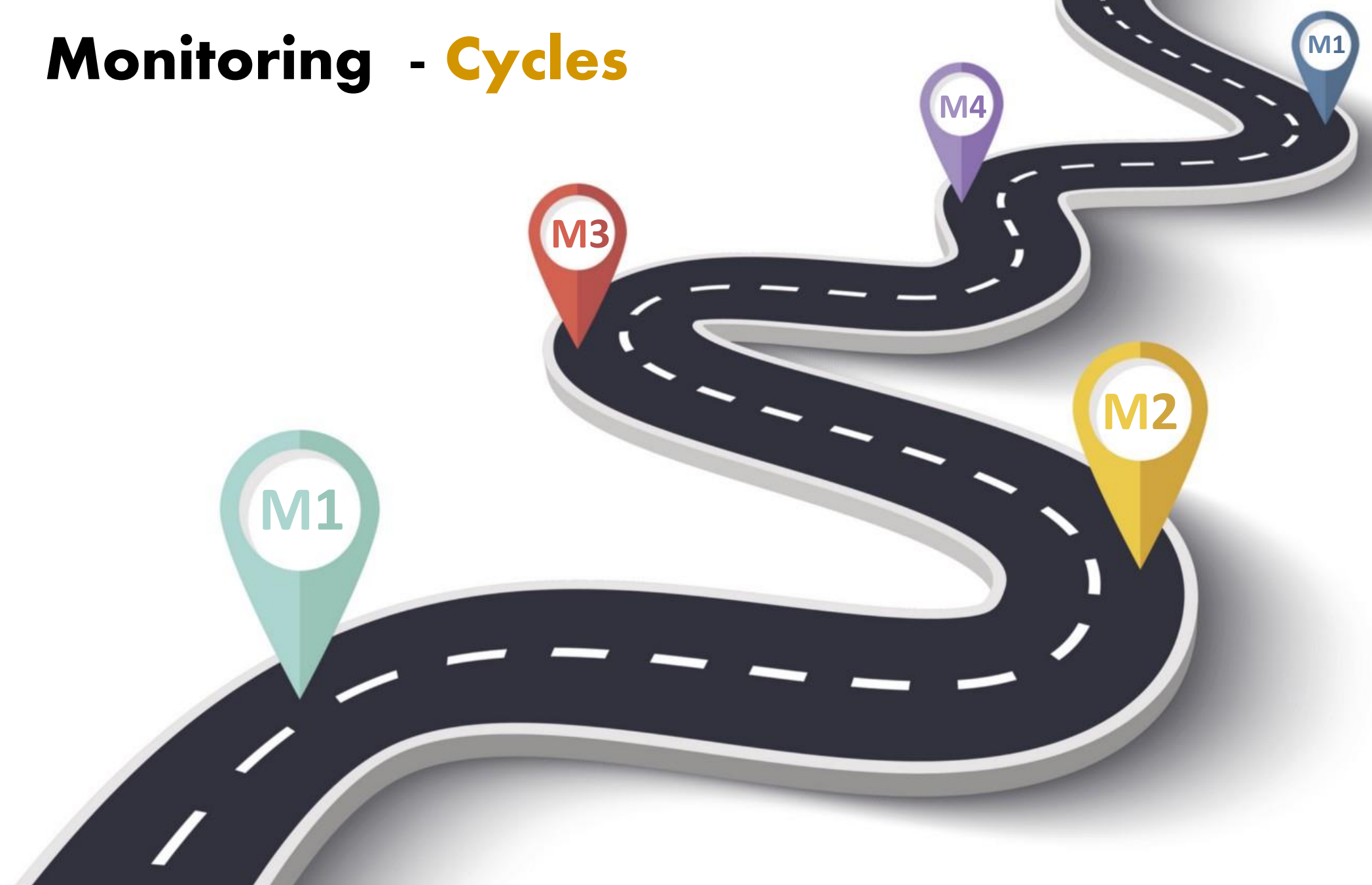

Approach to Learning Grade Descriptors

Outstanding: you are a role model to others

Monitoring

These are the areas that teachers will be assessing each monitoring cycle

Engagement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Focus in lessons, how well you are listening/concentrating• Participation in lessons, taking part in activities• How hard you try• How you respond to advice and improve your work
Community Conduct	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• How respectful you are to others – both staff and students so that you allow others to learn• How you behave – eg calm and considerate of others• How safe your behavior is both in class and around school
Personal Organisation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• How well you complete homework• How punctual and ready to learn you are• How well equipped you are for lessons and school – eg correct uniform, equipment, journal, etc

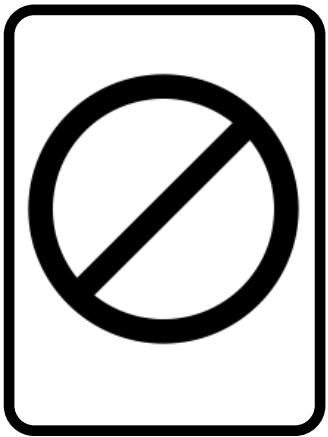
No Ear Phones

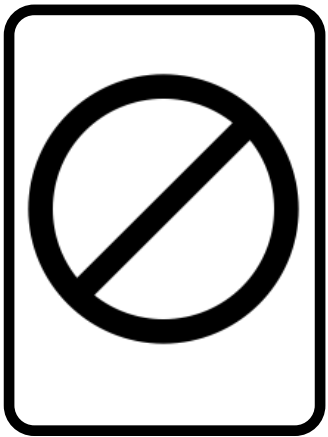

No banned items on site (**Vapes**)

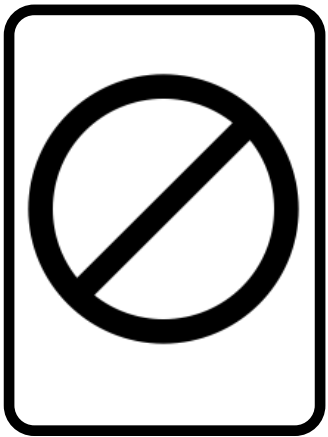


- Vapes contain nicotine - the addictive drug like in regular cigarettes.
- Nicotine can harm the developing adolescent brain. The brain keeps developing until about age 25.
- Using nicotine in adolescence can harm the parts of the brain that control attention, learning, mood, and impulse control.
- Vapes can contain other harmful substances besides nicotine and often contain far more nicotine than cigarettes.
- Using nicotine in adolescence may also increase risk for future addiction to other drugs.

No banned items on site (Searching)

- A staff member, at the request of the Headteacher, may search a student if it is believed they are in possession of an item which is **illegal, banned in our school or may affect the safety of themselves or others.**

Searching

(Government guidance)

1. Searching can play a critical role in ensuring that schools are safe environments for all pupils and staff. It is a vital measure to safeguard and promote staff and pupil welfare, and to maintain high standards of behaviour through which pupils can learn and thrive.

2. Headteachers and staff they authorise have a statutory power to search a pupil or their possessions where they have reasonable grounds to suspect that the pupil may have a prohibited item listed in paragraph 3¹ or any other item that the school rules² identify as an item which may be searched for.

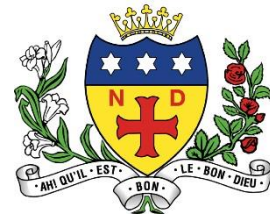
