


#### No banned items on site




#### No banned items on site (Vapes)





- Nicotine can harm the developing adolescent brain. The brain keeps developing until about age 25.
- Using nicotine in adolescence can harm the parts of the brain that control attention, learning, mood, and impulse control.
- Vapes can contain other harmful substances besides nicotine and often contain far more nicotine than cigarettes.
- Using nicotine in adolescence may also increase risk for future addiction to other drugs.





### No banned items on site (Searching)


A staff member, at the request of the Headteacher, may search a student if it is believed they are in possession of an item which is illegal, banned in our school or may affect the safety of themselves or others.

#### Searching

#### (Government guidance)

- Searching can play a critical role in ensuring that schools are safe environments for all pupils and staff. It is a vital measure to safeguard and promote staff and pupil welfare, and to maintain high standards of behaviour through which pupils can learn and thrive.
- 2. Headteachers and staff they authorise have a statutory power to search a pupil or their possessions where they have reasonable grounds to suspect that the pupil may have a prohibited item listed in paragraph 3<sup>1</sup> or any other item that the school rules<sup>2</sup> identify as an item which may be searched for.


