Remembrance Day English Writing Competition Winners

Rip the Rescue Dog

Rip, a crossbreed terrier, was discovered alone and hungry amidst the chaos following a heavy air raid on a popular London area by a local air raid warden in 1940. The warden, Mr E King, took pity on him, fed him some scraps and the pair became inseparable. Rip was the warden's search and rescue dog.

Rip was a stray when Mr King first found him but was soon adopted by the Air Raid Precautions (ARP). During the Blitz, he helped locate people and animals buried in the debris after an air raid. Rip was awarded the Dickin Medal for bravery in 1945 but died the same year. He was buried in 1946 in PDSA cemetery Ilford, England.

There are many examples of brave animal in war. Dogs are just one example of how loyal animals can be. There were horses, pigeons, cats and even a bear. Rip's story was a very emotional story but he saved many lives together with his friend Mr King.
