

Y12 Assessment Intervention Week

In all we held 44 meetings during the week with students who had achieved 2 or more U/E grades, or who on average were more than 1.25 of a grade away from their target. This was a very demanding week with some challenging but very positive conversations with both students and their parents. UCAS Fair

On the afternoon of Friday 16th of June, Y12 attended the annual Higher Education Fair held at Sheffield Arena. The feedback from this event was very positive with students taking in over 130 higher education and degree apprenticeship providers, as well as a variety of subject presentations.

Enrichment days

On Monday July 11th year 12 students attended Sheffield Hallam University in order to get a feel for university life; the visit consisted of presentations, campus tour as well as subject specific workshops. On Tuesday 11th, students were in school attending presentations/workshops covering year 13 revision plans, gap years, degree apprenticeships and personal statements. Y13 Results day Advice

On A Level results day, UCAS will come live at 8am. Students log on to UCAS to see if their place is confirmed. Possible scenarios:

- A. Students have the grades for their firm choice (or don't have the grades, but their firm choice still accepts them) - PLACE AT FIRM CHOICE CONFIRMED
- B. Students have the grades for their Insurance choice (or don't have the grades, but their Insurance choice still accepts them) – PLACE AT INSURANCE CHOICE CONFIRMED
- C. Students don't have the grades for either their firm or insurance choice they will then be eligible for Clearing and will receive a clearing number. Students can then ring as many universities as they wish and gain as many offers as possible over the phone, BUT CAN THEN ONLY PUT ONE DOWN THROUGH UCAS CLEARING LATER THAT DAY (Time TBC, but normally 4pm)

If a student changes their University, they then just need to book accommodation with that institution on Results day and update Student Finance with their new institution/course.

Congratulations!

If either your firm choice (or your insurance if you missed your firm offer) is marked unconditional, your place is secure. Make sure you check your emails (including junk mailbox) for info from the unis

Want to Change Uni?

Discouraged at this stage, but if you are sure you want to apply to other unis, self-release into Clearing by using (NB this cannot be undone) the "decline your place" button. You can do this from July 5th. NB – if accepted on your firm choice, your insurance choice is automatically declined, so you have to contact them to see if they have space, if you now wish to go there.

Place Confirmed

Universities may award the place, anyway, check your UCAS Hub application portal to see if your Firm or Insurance choice is marked as Confirmed (Unconditional).

Alternative Offer

Your Firm/Insurance uni may make you an alternative offer (e.g. for a different course), which you can accept or turn down on Track

Awaiting Decision

Your Firm/Insurance Choice may still be considering whether to award you a place, if you have missed the offer, contact them to find out if there is anything they need from you. You can "decline your place" to enter Clearing.

Grades Appeal

The grounds for appealing grades are limited. Info on this will be sent separately.

Appeal to University

You may be considered for an alternative course (e.g. foundation) at your preferred uni. Contact them if you'd like to see if this is possible.

Retake Exams

You can re-take exams in the next academic year and re-apply through the next UCAS cycle.

Clearing

If you still want to go to university, then you can use the Clearing process to find an alternative university place. See guide on Clearing and Clearing Plus.

Clearing

from the unis

You can contact universities with higher entry requirements than your original predictions, to see if they have space. If they do and they say they would offer you a place, you will then apply through Clearing. Do NOT enter Clearing until vou are sure vou want to do this/have an offer from another university. Entering Clearing will lose your current offers.

If you decline your place, you can use Clearing Plus, which will automatically show you potential options.

Withdraw

Use the "Decline your place" option to withdraw from your offer(s). NB this cannot be undone.

University Entrance Tests

Most courses and Universities do not require students to sit an entrance test. Please look on individual University websites or check at Open Days with regards to which institutions require these. The following tests will take place **in school** on **Wednesday 18**th **October.**

- BioMedical Admissions Test (BMAT)
- Test of Mathematics for University Admission (TMUA)
- Engineering Admissions Assessment (ENGAA)
- Natural Sciences Admissions Assessment (NSAA)
- Thinking Skills Assessment Section 1 (TSA S1)
- Thinking Skills Assessment (TSA)

Registration for these open on **1**st **September** and students register for these with Mrs Paine when they return to Year 13 in September.

For students interested in both Dentistry and Medicine, the **UCAT** entrance test may need to be sat. This is **NOT** sat in school and is booked by the students themselves. Registration for this opened on the **20**th **June** and closes on **21**st **September 2023**.

UCAS Sign-Up

All Year 12 students have now signed up to UCAS and have an account. Students can apply to University from **Monday 4**th **September**. The actual deadline for applications to be sent is **31**st **January 2024**, but we strongly suggest that students meet the school deadline of **30**th **November 2023**.

Please note applications to Dentistry, Medicine, Oxbridge and Veterinary have a deadline of **16**th **October 2023**.
