






## ATTENDANCE

#### **Nationally- Attendance and grade loss**

- At 96% attendance, about 73% of students achieve 5 good GCSE grades (grades 9-4 / A\*-C) including English & Maths.
- If attendance drops to 80-90%, only about 35% reach that threshold of 5 good GCSEs including English & Maths.
- Missing 17 days of school (approx.) is associated, on average,
   with dropping one GCSE grade in every subject






## ATTENDANCE

#### **Current Y11s Midsize results 2025- Attendance and grade loss**


- On average, students with 95% attendance and above achieved close to a grade higher than their target +0.95
- On average, students with attendance between 86-95% attendance got results that were below their target at -0.32
- On average students with attendance less than 86% got results that were over a grade lower than their target at -1.12





















All expectations and rules should have a obvious purpose and be clearly communicated.







Engagemen	<ul> <li>Focus in lessons, how well you are listening/concentrating</li> <li>Participation in lessons, taking part in activities</li> <li>How hard you try</li> <li>How you respond to advice and improve your work</li> </ul>	
Community Conduct	<ul> <li>How respectful you are to others – both staff and students so that you allow others to learn</li> <li>How you behave – eg calm and considerate of others</li> <li>How safe your behavior is both in class and around school</li> </ul>	
Personal Organisation	<ul> <li>How well you complete homework</li> <li>How punctual and ready to learn you are</li> <li>How well equipped you are for lessons and school – eg correct uniform, equipment, journal, etc</li> </ul>	






