3. Reward and recognition





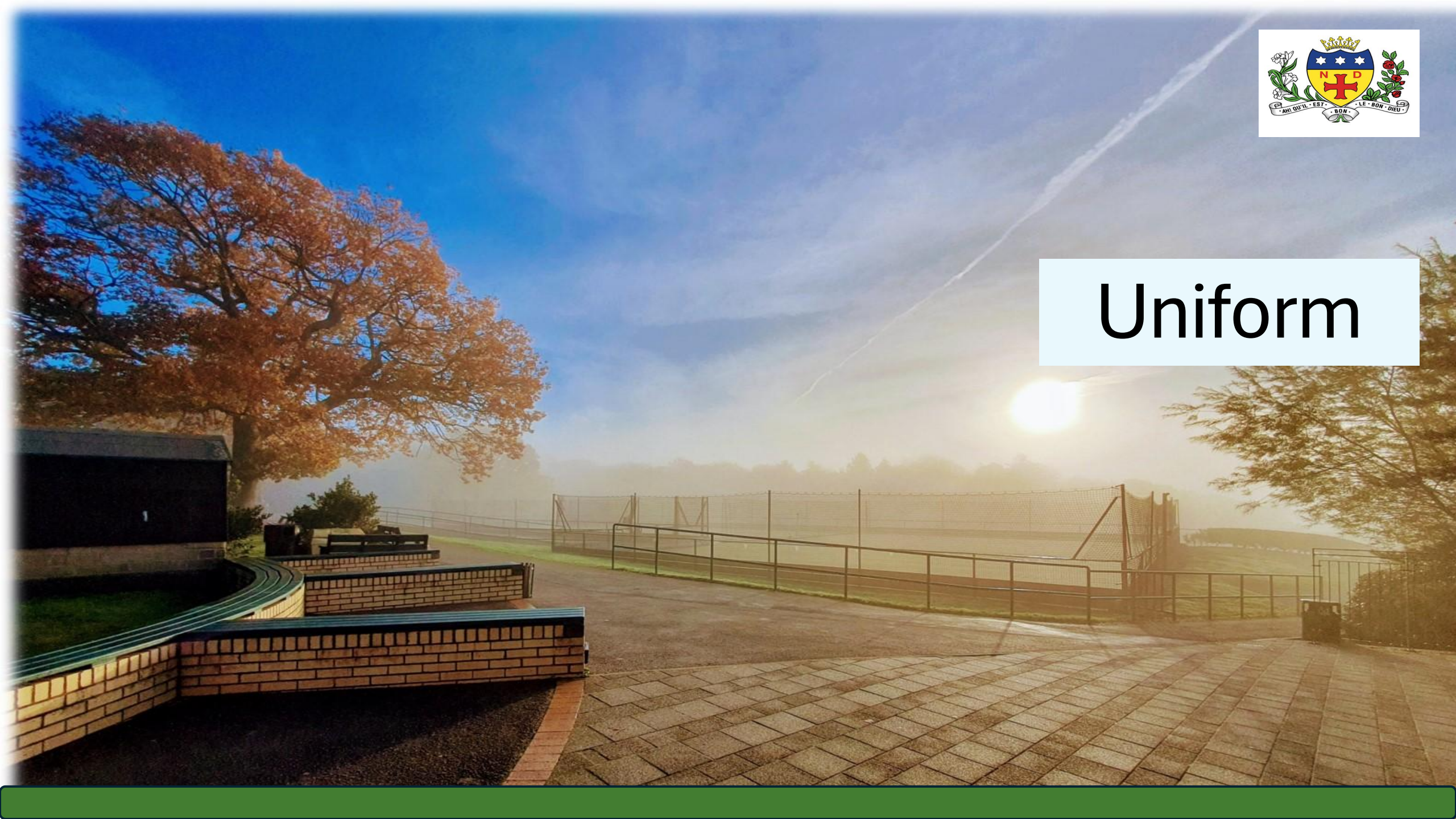








Uniform



By accepting your school place you have agreed to our uniform policy.

The reasons we have a uniform are:

- 1) It unites us as a community
- 2) It promotes equality & inclusivity
 - Less expensive than non uniform clothes
 - Everyone looks the same so it avoids unhelpful subgroups of students who may be in conflict with our values and ethics.



- 3) It is based on our students being ready to learn
- 4) Health & Safety – PE, practical subjects







Correct Uniform



Skirts

- Have to have the badge which must be visible –no old style skirts
- Worn to the knee

Jumper

- School jumper must be worn and not the PE sweatshirt during the day
- It must come to school everyday
- The jumper is the school uniform not a coat. If a student needs to wear a coat then their jumper must be on as well

Hoodies/Sweatshirts/Coats with logos

- These should not be worn at any time in school- including leaving the premises
- If a student is cold in winter they need to layer up underneath the polo shirt and jumper



Correct uniform



Shoes

All black full leather school shoes: flat, full show covering all of the top of the foot and fastened onto the foot with laces or straps.

'Slip ons' – only if they cover the majority of the foot

Doc Martens- yellow stitching- ok

Shoe should be suitable for all weather types and wipeable

No fabric, suede, mesh, canvas, no coloured logos



Correct uniform - coats

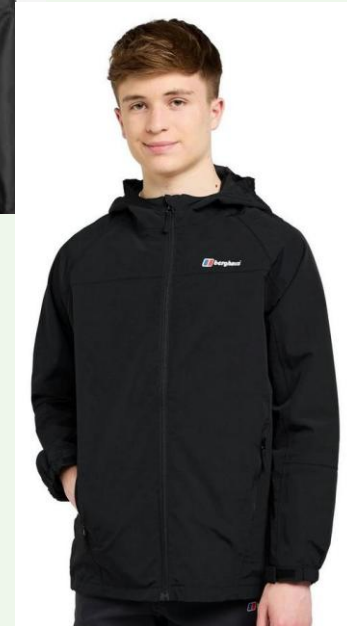


There will be times of the day when students are outside and will need to be prepared for the changing weather.

We ask all students to have a waterproof coat with them at all times so that they are warm and dry, able to feel comfortable and successful with their learning in the classroom.

Light rain-when not in the canteen or under the shelter, students will be outside.

No hoodies are allowed during the school day



Correct uniform – socks/tights



All students must wear knee or ankle length black socks

Girls can wear black tights



Correct uniform - Bags



- A rucksack
- Be able to fit an A4 folder or book into
- Be waterproof-you are moving between buildings
- No handbags
- Be able to be fastened closed
- Not have camouflage or animal print on
- No small rucksacks



Jewellery



• What is allowed:

- 1 pair of small stud earrings worn in the lobe
- Religious medal or cross worn under the shirt.

What isn't allowed

- Multiple earrings
- Hoop earrings
- Nose studs or plastic retainers
- Necklaces
- Rings
- Bracelets
- Anklets
- Tongue piercing

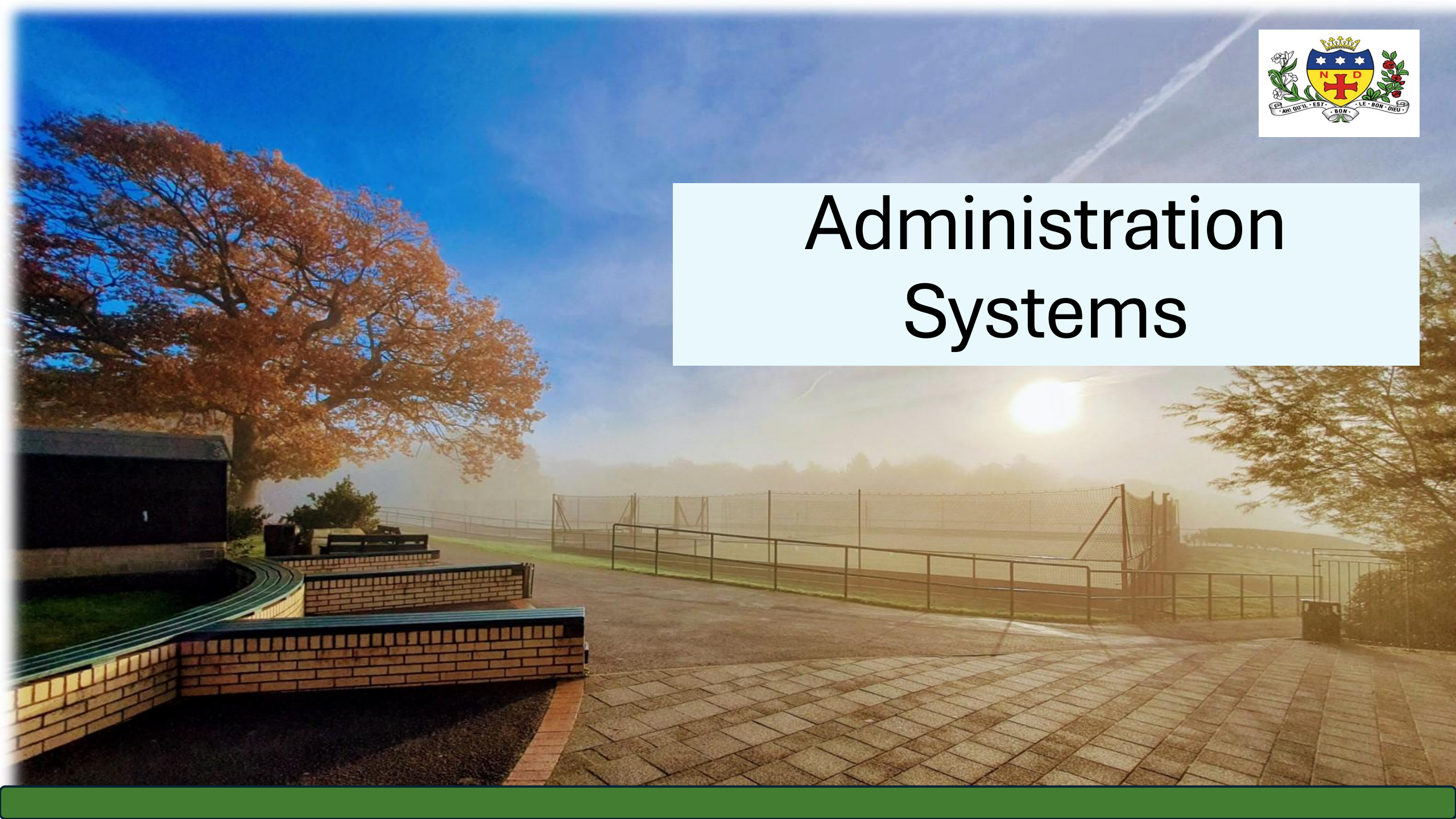
What financial support is there for uniform?
